## Numeracy and Literacy Catch-Up 2016/17

This year we received a grant of £14,500 directly from the Department of Education to fund numeracy and literacy intervention programmes for students in Year 7 who had not achieved expected standard and were considered to be 'not secondary ready'.

## Numeracy and Literacy

At the start of the year, following Key Stage 2 results, forty students were identified as not achieving the expected standard in both English and Mathematics. They have been divided in to two classes who are taught by a primary school specialist for all of their mathematics, English Language and English Literature lessons, as well as additional literacy lessons. The role of the primary school specialist will be to focus on developing core key skills in English and Mathematics. They will be expected to devise a transition curriculum suitable for students considered to be not secondary ready.
