

What do the different categories of need in the Extended Learning Department at QEGS actually mean?

The government has re-assigned the way in which we report on students with Special Educational Needs, as of 1st September 2014, with the introduction of the New Code of Practice (0-25) 2014.

We are now only given two codes, to replace the three that we had previously, and these are "E" and "K". We have made further codes at QEGS, to ensure that teachers are alerted to individual students' difficulties and needs accurately.

In a nutshell:

Old government code	New government code	New QEGS codes
S = Statement of Educational Need	E = Statement of Educational Need OR Education, Health and Care Plan (new version of statements)	E
SAP = School Action Plus (outside agencies involved but no actual statement attached to the student)	K = School SEN Support	AENL = Additional Educational Needs for Learning (minimum of 9.5 hours of extra support per week for each student on this list)
A = School Action (Additional Support within school context)	K = School SEN Support	<u>AEN</u> = Additional Educational Needs, so... <u>AEND</u> = Dyslexia <u>AENM</u> = Medical needs <u>AENA</u> = examination concessions, Literacy and Numeracy interventions <u>AENP</u> = Physical Literacy intervention programme in place
