

PROGRESSION

- Multiple Agriculture students progressed through the levels post 16, to complete level 2, 3 and 4 Apprenticeships.
 - These learners have either now completed and achieved or are due to achieve in the next 12-18 Months.
- Large percentage of Agriculture learners stay on with their placement farms to complete apprenticeships
 - (2017-2019, 5 of 9 learners secured apprenticeships at the same farm)
- Animal care and Equine learners progressing to college to level 3 courses

- Last year QEGS Learner now secured apprenticeship with JCB farms

SUCCESS STORIES

Lady Manners, Horticulture provision

DART learners at Lady Manners School are making excellent progress with their Practical Horticulture qualification. They access the provision on the school site using a specially designed greenhouse and trugs provided by Derbyshire County Council. Since starting last September Josh and Chris have created seasonal displays of spring flowering bulbs in the trugs which are now in full display. They have designed and produced winter hanging baskets, Christmas planters and wreaths which have been sold with proceeds used to kit out the greenhouse. They are currently setting vegetables and flowers to eventually have produce for sale. With their assessor's support they have both secured schoolwork experience opportunities within the local Horticultural sector.

Bill Dinley, Josh's uncle said "The course is run in a very friendly atmosphere and has given Josh an opportunity to learn basic gardening skills and develop his interest in horticulture in a creative way whilst helping Josh to improve his social skills through working with others. Course visits to Chatsworth Gardens and a community garden have also given Josh the opportunity to meet and talk to professional gardeners. Josh has been inspired by his instructor along with the people that he has met through these visits. Since starting the course Josh has felt a sense of achievement, he feels that he has contributed to the school's environment with his work in the garden, he will leave a legacy at a school that has been a major part of his life. It is thanks to the DART course that we hope Josh will go on to achieve greater things in horticulture, working in an environment that he loves".
