Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Staff



It has been a real boost to see our students and staff back onsite this week. Learning, interacting, being active, meeting our expectations and keeping themselves and others safe. There really is no substitute for face-to-face learning. There are lots of routines and procedures to remember and lots of new information to take on board too. Thank you to all stakeholders for continuing to support our return to school, for being patient and understanding of the complexity this has entailed and for re-iterating to your children the importance of doing things safely.

## **Testing Centre update**

Thank you to our excellent team of staff and volunteers who have made our testing process so successful over the last week. We have now completed the first round of testing and move on to the second and third in-school. These tests will follow the same sort of routine as the first, except now Year 7,8 and 9 students will come to the Testing Centre with their class teachers, and Years 10 and 11 will arrive according to their surnames. The days of testing will be as follows:

Sixth Form students have now completed their testing in school; home testing kits will be issued to Year 12/13 students next week.

Please allow up to 24 hours for the NHS text message to come through to the mobile number given at the time of registration. If the mobile number is incorrectly given, it cannot be amended after registration has taken place. Please be assured, if a positive result is recorded, school will be in contact directly with parents/carers prior to NHS message being sent to notify before the end of the day tested in school.

# Yr11 and Yr13 summer grades

We are committed to ensuring our Yr11/13 students enjoy their last few months with us and that they receive the grades they deserve. Information regarding summer grades, assessments, leaving dates and other matters related to the summer term are being shared with Yr11 and 13 via assemblies (Yr13 assembly was on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> March, Yr11 assembly will be on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March). A follow up letter with further details will also be issued next week which should address queries.

## **School Transport**

Whilst most students complied with the rules of travelling by bus in the autumn term, we had reports that some students did not. Where a student who uses school transport tested positive for Covid, it was difficult to pinpoint the close contacts as some students had not maintained their seating arrangement. Whilst we can have some control over where students sit when they leave school, it is difficult to oversee where they sit on the morning journey to school. Please speak to your child about their routine and seating on the school bus. Maintaining regular seating routines is essential to limiting unnecessary self-isolations if positive cases are confirmed.



- The majority of the larger vehicles have seating plans; seating plans can also be viewed in school corridors
  and students can ask Form Tutors to check number if unsure. Students must sit in these seats for the journey
  both to and from school.
- On arrival at school, spot checks will be carried out to assure ourselves that we know who our students have been in contact with. Please can you stress the importance of this with your child.
- All students must wear a face covering and sanitise their hands when they board and disembark from the school bus. If exempt from wearing a face covering; please make sure sunflower lanyard/exemption badge is visible or student may be challenged by the driver.
- Face coverings must be worn for the duration of the journey and not be removed at any time.
- Students must sit in their designated seat as per the seating plan and remain in these seats for the duration
  of the journey. Students will be organised into year groups before they board any bus when departing school
  at the end of the day.
- Transport providers and the authority governing these buses have the right to remove any students' right to travel on school transport should their behaviour be unsafe and/or a breach of the guidelines above.
- If we do not feel able to confidently identify who has or has not been a close contact, we will be forced to isolate entire buses to protect other members of the school community.

## **Sixth Form Update**

It has been great to welcome back our Year 12 and 13 students this week and we would like to thank all KS5 students for their positivity and corporation with regards to their transition back into the classroom.

We have had extended tutorial sessions every day this week, which have provided our KS5 tutor team with some additional opportunities to support our Sixth Formers with their return to face-to-face learning; and also to launch some exciting new opportunities and activities available across the Sixth Form. As part of this we have launched the UCAS process with Year 12, providing them with information and advice around how to start their research into the range of post-18 options available to them including university courses and higher-level apprenticeships. All students have now signed up to UCAS Hub which we will be encouraging and supporting them to use over the next few weeks as we progress further into the UCAS process. They have been provided with support from their teachers in class over the past few days to help them plan for this and have also been offered study leave during this time period to allow them additional time to prepare. This means that all Year 13 A-Level students will return to lessons on Wednesday 24th March. There are different arrangements in place for students on the BTEC and vocational courses, as these courses have different requirements at this stage. Students in these subject areas have been provided with information on the plan for the next few weeks and have also been asked to attend lessons as normal next week.
