Thank you for being so supportive of our return to onsite, face to face learning. Today, we have welcomed back our 'shielding' students and staff, who have been managing their teaching and learning from home. The last 12 months has been a real challenge and I am really proud of what we have all achieved together. What we do now and how we act next will help determine our next 12 months.

Community Safeguarding:

Now more than ever, our community spirit and sense of responsibility will be key to helping to repair and restore the lifestyles that we once took for granted.

Warmer weather, along with recently changed outdoor restrictions has meant that our students have been able to see their friends in small groups, maintaining social distancing and respecting the local environment and members of our community.

Unfortunately, some of our students have not been respectful of each other and the local environment when they have socialised in the local park and in other areas such as Mappleton bridge. In fact, some students have potentially jeopardised these freedoms for others by not following Covid laws, causing anti-social behaviour, damaging school property (most notably trespassing and damaging the fencing and equipment on the school Astro-Turf) and mixing with young adults where we know drugs and alcohol have been consumed.

We want to work with parents, the police and the local community to keep our young people safe and ensure we have high quality, community amenities which can be accessed and used by all. Therefore, we ask for your support:

- Please check where you children are going/have been and with whom.
- We have found that many concerns either stem from or are exacerbated by inappropriate use of mobile
 phones, photographs/videos and social media. Please check and challenge how your child is using this
 medium to ensure they remain safe and do not compromise the wellbeing of others.
- Remind your children of their responsibility to keep themselves and others safe (your family too!), by maintaining social distancing and respecting the current Covid laws when mixing outdoors.
- If you observe any anti-social behaviour, trespassing on school property (specifically our Astro-Turf) or other private land/property please call the police straight away on 101 for non-emergency, 999 for emergency matters. Please also inform us at school. We want to keep everyone safe and we will cooperate fully with the police and support parents when concerns arise.

COVID-19 Home-Testing

Thank you to our students and staff for the excellent start to home-testing. This now needs to continue over the Easter holidays and into the next school term. Students and staff have enough tests to do this twice per week, preferably on Monday and Thursday mornings in the first week and then Wednesday and Sunday in second week. Please remember to test before returning to school after Easter.

Reporting Symptoms and Positive Tests of COVID-19 During the Easter Holidays

Although we will not be in school we are still required to notify if we have symptoms of COVID-19 and/or a positive test result. School needs to be notified on 07890319042 if a member of staff or student develops symptoms of COVID-19 or tests Positive at any time up to and including the 7th April 2021. We also need to know as soon as possible if a student or member of staff has symptoms or tests positive at a time which will affect their return to school at the start of the new term.

HPV Vaccination Day Tuesday 20th April 2021

On Tuesday 20th April we will be hosting a vaccination service which will involve around 450 students, mainly from Years 7 & 8. Those families involved will have received a letter via email yesterday.

Go 4 Schools

One thing we have definitely gained from this recent time is a greater communication between school and parents. We would like to continue with this further and encourage students to know that school and parents are there to support them with their education.

You may know that, at QEGS, we use Go 4 Schools to record all behaviour events, homework and now attendance of students at school. We would encourage you to download the app so you can keep up to date with behaviour events your children may have had, homework they have been set and their attendance. There will be an updated user guide on our website to navigate this app. You can choose which notifications you receive to create bespoke communication.

TT Rockstars

We have recently purchased a subscription to the TT Rockstars website. This is a fantastic resource to help your child with their mathematics fluency, particularly their times tables. Your child can ask their maths teacher for their login if they do not have it already.

Census

In Maths and Geography lessons this week students have been looking at the national census and why it is important. They have also completed their own mini census in school and analysed the results of this.
