#### Student behaviour and conduct in the community:

Warmer weather, along with recently changed outdoor restrictions has meant that our students have been able to see their friends in small groups, maintaining social distancing and respecting the local environment and members of our community.

Unfortunately, some of our students are not being respectful of each other, the local environment and local residents when they are away from school.

We will work with parents, the police and the local community to keep our young people safe and ensure we have a safe and welcoming environment. Therefore, we ask for your support:

- Please check where you children are going/have been and with whom.
- We have found that many concerns either stem from or are exacerbated by inappropriate use of mobile phones, photographs/videos and social media. Please check and challenge how your child is using their phone to ensure they remain safe and are being kind to others.
- Remind your children of their responsibility to keep themselves and others safe (your family too!), by maintaining social distancing and respecting the current Covid laws when mixing outdoors.
- If you observe any anti-social behaviour, trespassing on school property (specifically our Astro-Turf) or other private land/property please call the police straight away on 101 for non-emergency, 999 for emergency matters. Please also inform us at school. We want to keep everyone safe and we will cooperate fully with the police and support parents when concerns arise.
