## Staffordshire Moorlands Connect Bus Service Proposal and Survey

Staffordshire Moorlands Connect have been selected by the Department of Transport to design, develop and implement a Demand Responsive Transport (DRT) service in Staffordshire Moorlands over the next 3 – 4 years; this service will build on the existing Moorlands Connect service and will be integrated with local bus services, offering an app-based booking and scheduling system. While the finer details are still being worked up, the service will commence in September 2021. The service will integrate with the Leek to Ashbourne, Buxton to Ashbourne and Buxton to Leek local bus service, providing opportunities for residents and visitors to access services and to enjoy the Staffordshire Peak District.

Staffordshire CC would really welcome support (residents in SCC area/possible users of the bus) with this project, as they believe it could be of real benefit to children in the outlying rural areas, particularly those attending before or after school clubs and those over 16 who are no longer eligible for school transport.

### **Delicious Sustainability in Year 9**

The bananas donated were used in Mrs Flinders' two Year 9 classes to produce approximately 30 banana loaves. We linked it to sustainability and food waste which is something we are looking at currently.
