This final version of the school day maintains teaching and learning time at 5 hours; prioritises student wellbeing at the start of each day; provides quality social time for eating and drinking; ensures our rich and diverse co-curricular programme can be offered and staffed beyond 3.20pm; and ensures students have sufficient time for their own interests and pursuits out of school. We will keep all stakeholders fully briefed on the impact of these changes.

Fire Drills

At some point next week we will be holding a fire drill. Please could you take the time to discuss the importance of such events, and the need for swift, calm and quiet action. Students will be lining up in tutor groups.

Face Coverings on School Buses and Public Transport

Over the last week, school has received messages from bus providers to inform some students are forgetting their face coverings on the journey to school in the morning. If a child is not wearing a lanyard to indicate exemption from wearing a face covering, travel may be refused by the driver; it is for the safety of all passengers and the driver that face coverings are worn.

Student Lanyards and ID Cards

These are an essential part of our school uniform, our safeguarding protocols and also our COVID risk assessment:

- Coloured lanyards to see easily identify a year group bubble
- ID cards for door access controls to keep site and buildings safe and secure
- ID cards to identify students
- ID cards for contactless payment in the canteen

Therefore, these items of uniform are one of the first priorities checked each day during form time, at the start/end of every lesson and whilst moving around the school.

Replacement items can be ordered by Form Teachers. Students must not leave Form Time without a replacement lanyard and/or ID.

Lanyards and IDs must be worn, not carried in pockets. They must be complete and fully functional.

We must all help keep students safe, keep staff safe and keep our operational procedures fit for purpose.

Staff will be checking and challenging, please support your child and get any missing/broken items replaced asap!

Finally

There are so many fantastic things taking place in school at the moment and we want to keep as many students as possible in school to enjoy their summer term. We have proven that we can keep Covid transmission and cases low and we want to ensure that this remains the case in the coming weeks and months. This week we have reported two positive cases of COVID-19. We are also aware infection rates are rising locally, and more rapidly still in nearby towns. It therefore remains essential for everyone to observe government guidelines on social gathering and key messages such as 'hands-face-space'.

- It is more important than ever for our students to test twice per week, preferably before school on a Monday and Thursday.
- All results should be reported to the NHS via the link in the test kits and to us at school via our website. If the result is positive, you must inform both us and the NHS immediately.
- If you are informing us during school hours, please phone Student Services. If it is out of school hours, please telephone 07890319042. This number is staffed both before school and in the evenings.
- Remember, if someone tests positive with a lateral flow test the person MUST self-isolate and must not leave the home without permission from the NHS or attend school.
