## Duke of Edinburgh's Award: Bronze

I am writing to let you know of the exciting opportunity available to your child to achieve the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award through the academy. The Award is an adventure from beginning to end, with students enjoying many new experiences, discovering talents that they did not realise they had, challenging their potential, and standing out from the crowd. Many businesses and universities value the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and believe candidates to be more rounded and employable individuals.

The Award involves four sections that students have to complete: Physical, Skill, Service and Expedition. The Expedition section of the Award is fully organised by the academy, using Approved Activities Providers.

The Bronze Award is available to Year 9 students, and they have until the age of 24 to complete the sections. Our aim is for students to be well on the way to completing the Award by the beginning of Year 10.

The 'Expedition' section of the Award involves two separate weekends (Practice Expedition and an Assessed Expedition) where the students will walk for two days and camp for one night, proving that they can be self-sufficient. Both these weekends will be in the Peak District National Park and/or the surrounding area and will be reliant on parents and carers dropping students off at the start of the expeditions, and picking them up at the end. The expeditions vary depending on groups and campsites available and this information will be given to you and your child nearer the time of the expedition. It is my initial intention that they complete the Practice and the Assessed Expedition by June 2022, thus giving them ample time in Year 10 to have the option of completing the Silver before the pressures of their GCSEs in Year 11.

To conform to the guidelines set out by the Duke of Edinburgh's Award itself, students must partake in the Practice Expedition to qualify for the Assessed Expedition. If a student fails to attend any of these weekends, further options may be available to them.

As this is a co-curricular activity, students will be expected to spend some of their lunchtimes and after school hours undertaking training in camp craft and map navigation, to enable them to undertake the expedition.

Due to the high numbers of students taking part in this Award, it is essential that students are on the way to completing all three sections that make up the Award before they will be permitted to undertake the Expeditions.

Enrolment for the Award is £24.00, this covers the cost for the Enrolment through the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and additional paperwork costs through school such as sending out certificates etc. This amount does not include the trip fees for the Expedition. This will be set up separately in the new year and will cost in the region of £150.

To secure your child's place on the Bronze Award £24.00 will be required by 17<sup>th</sup> December 2021, via the ParentPay system\*.
