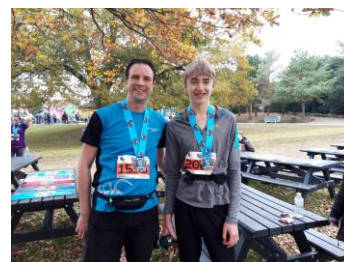


Congratulations
