

Safer Internet Day and Breck Foundation

On Tuesday 8th February 2022 we marked 'Safer Internet Day' and 'Sexual Abuse and Sexual Violence Awareness Week'. As I am sure you will agree, marking these awareness days are so important to the safety and wellbeing of our young people.

We began with a presentation from PCSO Ellis Hacking and PCSO Sarah Dufton of the Digital Police. They informed students how to stay safe online and the legalities around online usage. They introduced us to a couple of resources which we feel parents would be interested in:

What 3 Words - By downloading this app, close contacts and emergency services can pinpoint someone's exact location if in danger https://what3words.com/pretty.needed.chill

Hollie Guard - In danger? With a simple shake or tap it activates Hollie Guard, immediately notifying your chosen contacts, pinpointing your location and sending audio and video evidence directly to their mobile phones. https://www.hollieguard.com/

Following on from the 'Safer Internet Day' assemblies, we will be hosting online sessions on Monday 14th February for Years 7-11, which will be delivered by a trainer from The Breck Foundation. The Breck Foundation campaigns for a safer internet for all children and young people – whether they are gaming, communicating on social media, using apps or taking part in any other internet-based activity.
