Our Year 10 GCSE students have got off to flying start this term! They have been making fresh pasta with pesto or tomato and basil sauce, sausage plaits and shortcrust pastry for quiches, each student choosing or adapting their recipes to suit their own and their families' tastes.

Meanwhile Year 9 have been making lasagne and it has gone down so well we have had requests for the recipe

Over the course of the last term Year 9 DI students have been making decorative wooden boxes. Students have learned to cut finger joints for the corners, apply a decorative finish for the lids by laminating a combination of hard and soft woods. Further to this they have designed and manufactured an alternative lid using CAD/CAM to machine a design using one of our CNC routers. All boxes show an amazing attention to detail as they are very accurate and finished to a commercial standard. All students have developed significantly since September. Well done Year 9 DI students.
