Online Safety

Christmas is a time where some young people may be getting a new electronic device, or even their first one, whether it is a smartphone, smart watch, smart speakers, laptop, games console or tablet. Please remember to communicate your expectations about usage to the children in your care. If you would like to find out more about new connected devices, <u>this guide</u> from Internet Matters, is a good place to start.

Online safety and use of phones in school

It is with regret that we must outline this in the last bulletin before Christmas but we are aware of a number of videos that have been recorded of incidents between students on site and then shared on social media.

Firstly, we do not condone students fighting in school or bullying of any kind. These are dealt with in line with our behaviour policy and can result in severe sanctions. While these incidents are very serious, fortunately they are not commonplace, and the vast majority of our students behave in a calm and safe manner.

We must also outline that **mobile phones are not to be used on site between 8.50am and 3.20pm**. Any student who is seen using their phone will have it confiscated and parents will be expected to collect it from school after the second confiscation.

But most importantly we must outline that any student found or suspected to have recorded an incident in school then shared it on social media will be issued with severe sanctions including suspension and being reported to the police. Our students have the right to receive their education in a school where they feel happy and where they do not feel threatened or frightened by others around them. It is, therefore, important that students not only understand that they have this right but that with it they also take on the responsibility of ensuring that everyone else has the same right.

Please speak to your children about the following:

- if you receive a video online of an incident between students please do not forward on- you could also be at risk of severe sanctions
- Report this immediately to an adult
- Do not use your phone in school hours!
- Do not record any incident between students or anyone in general. Please be a good citizen and rather than stand and record, report immediately to seek assistance

We will be doing some more focussed work on cyber bullying and digital footprint upon our return in January. Thank you for your support with this.
