Lubrizol Visit and Workshops

On Monday Year 11 students were fortunate to participate in an activity run by local chemistry company, Lubrizol. The sessions were designed to put Life Cycle Assessments into a real-world context and also show that science-based careers do not necessarily mean working in a laboratory wearing a lab coat and safety goggles. In their teams, students used data to calculate and analyse the impact on the environment of a petrol car compared to an electric car, over 100,001 miles. Not only did this give students an insight into how chemistry is used by businesses but also gave them a chance to use transferable employability skills, such as teamwork and communication to market their product. There were various prizes awarded to groups that demonstrated effective collaboration and as the morning wore on news of this spread to other tutor groups which increased the competitiveness of some students! It was a fantastic day and Year 11 students represented themselves and the school impeccably.



Design and Innovation

As our Design and Innovation groups have just moved onto their next rotations, here is a showcase of the great work students have produced within the department.



National Youth Dance Company Workshop

The dance department welcomed professional dancers from the National Youth Dance Company who worked with our Year 9, 10 and 11 dancers. They had the opportunity to work with different dance material and develop their own repertoire which will support them in choreography towards their BTEC dance course. It was a nice chance to learn from other dance teachers as we all move in different ways. They learnt some material which was created for the NYDC who are based at Sadlers Wells in London. Students were informed of their training programme for ages 16-18 during the school holidays and how it supported them to progress into the dance industry to train further or work.



Boys Rugby

The Year 7-9 boys rugby teams travelled to St Joseph's College in Stoke on Saturday morning. It was fantastic to see so many boys committed to playing school rugby. The Year 7's game finished in a 6-6 draw, Year 8's won a tightly fought match 7-6 and the Year 9's suffered a narrow defeat 24-17. Well done to all involved.



BTEC Sport and Exercise Science National Extended Diploma Last Thursday our Sixth Form students who study the BTEC Sport and Exercise Science National Extended Diploma took a trip to the High Performance Unit at Derby University. We took part in a Sports Therapy session where we learned a range of taping techniques to combat injury, and also a Strength and Conditioning session in which we learned the techniques and safety points around performing compound lifts.



Year 7 Football - Cup Match Win vs Frederick Gent School



The Year 7 Boys' U12 Football team won 4-0 against Frederick Gent School this week, which now puts them through to the quarterfinals of the Derbyshire County Cup. The long-range goal from Captain Alfie W will not be forgotten and the boys were again outstanding ambassadors for QEGS. We now wait to see who the boys will play in the final eight. Year 8 Camping Trip

Exciting news - our Year 8 camping trip is almost ready to be opened for booking. This year we will be heading back to Yorkshire but staying the week at How Stean Gorge. There will be several adventurous activities such as gorge walking, stand up paddle boarding, canoeing, abseiling and climbing. We leave QEGS on 17th July and return on 21st July. Places strictly limited to 90 and places will be allocated via a lottery if demand exceeds this number, it will not be first come first served. Cost is £340 per child and is inclusive of transport, activities, camping and food. Look out for a letter with information to sign up in the near future.

Years 7, 8 and 9 Final Week of Summer Term

In addition, for Years 7-9 (inc those Year 8s not camping) - the final week of term will be filled with educational trips and activities on site linked to personal development and raising aspirations. Sixth Form Update

This week we welcomed Mr Robert Court, Liberal Democrats prospective parliamentary candidate for the Derbyshire Dales. He asked Year 13 students about their main concerns (NHS and cost of living) and spoke about the 2019 General Election and the distribution of votes, what that means for Parliament, together with some information about how to vote and the need for photographic ID. As it is National Apprenticeship Week, they watched videos created by previous QEGS students describing their experience of the recruitment process and life as an apprentice.
