Dear Sixth Form Students and Parents/Carers

Sixth Form Bursary Scheme (16-19 Bursary Fund)

I am writing to remind you that as a school we have access to a Sixth Form Bursary Fund which can be used to help support the education of students from households where there is greatest financial need.

I am pleased to inform you that we have been able to increase the eligibility threshold to reflect the increases to the cost of living. Therefore, if your total household income (from whatever source) is less than £37,000 per year then you may now be eligible.

The bursary has been extremely beneficial to students in our Sixth Form and has been used to support/purchase the following:

- Transport to and from Sixth Form
- Revision guides and course textbooks
- Laptops/IT equipment
- Train fares to university/apprenticeship open days
- School based trips
- Course equipment and stationery
- Uniform

If you think you are eligible, the Bursary Application Form is attached for you to complete along with the submission of any documentation as requested. Photocopies of original documents are acceptable.

Completed forms will need to be returned to Mrs V Smith in the Sixth Form office or via email smithv@qegs.email.

What Happens Next?

In order to decide how best to use an individual student's bursary funding, QEGS Sixth Form employs the following procedures:

- Every student who qualifies for a bursary is offered an opportunity to have an informal meeting with a member of the Sixth Form pastoral team to decide the best way to allocate their support.
- Priority areas are addressed first, including travel to school, equipment costs and support with studies.
- Students are allocated a higher amount of funding at the beginning of their course to address the priority areas.
- A percentage of the funding is kept back as a hardship funding to respond to any emergencies that may arise during the year.

How is the Bursary Paid?

The amount awarded will be dependent on the amount of income – this is allocated on different levels, as follows:

- L1 discretionary bursary: total income is equal to, or less than, £16,190
- L2 discretionary bursary: total income is more than £16,190, but less than £25,000
- L3 discretionary bursary: total income is more than £25000, but less than £37,000

Students who apply will be assessed individually. This assessment will be documented and evidence to support the claims will be obtained and retained for auditing purposes.

However, once the level has been agreed, students will be able to submit claims for equipment, transport, trips etc to help support their studies and they will receive the required amount to cover these costs.
