### What to do if a school bus breaks down?

Following a break down of a school bus this morning on route to school and some confusion from students what they should do/miscommunication from the driver:

- Students should stay on the bus unless it is unsafe to do so (fire or risk of being hit by another vehicle).
- Students should wait with the driver until a replacement bus arrives to continue the route to school.
- The driver/bus company will make contact with school to let us know of the problem and how long a replacement vehicle will take to arrive.
- Students travelling expecting to sit exams that day are not to worry – consideration will be given on arrival to school and you will be given the full time to complete an exam.

Derbyshire School Transport/school were made aware too late this morning, to provide suitable guidance to students/parents/carers. The breakdown has been followed up with the bus company.

### A Level Biology

The Year 12 A level biology students enjoyed a field trip to Cavedale near Castleton last Tuesday.
