#### **Year 6 Transitions**

What a wonderful, fun filled few days we had! We had a huge variety of lessons taking place and all Year 6 students got stuck in with great enthusiasm. Activities ranged from practical science experiments learning about acids, guided tours learning about the history of QEGS, blackout poetry in English, teambuilding and DofE map reading skills... and the list goes on! Thank you to our super star QEGS Leaders for helping out.











## **Space Science and Astronomy Group**

Monday was our last Space science and astronomy group. A huge thank you to Mr Greatbatch who has been coming in and giving us some amazing insight, information and enthusiasm all. We have talked about black holes, exoplanets and the Sun. We have visited the observatory and investigated Sunspots and constellations and equipment to view them (unfortunately the weather often chooses to be cloudy when we are there!) – we have made a model of the Artemis rocket and researched the rocket itself. We have looked at the potential colonisation of Mars and considered all aspects from politics to food and travel to water. We had the Starchaser rocket visit school and discussed the opportunities for working in the space industry. Our final project is unfinished and will be continued in September – we are going to build a model of a section of the moon and work out how humans could inhabit the Moon. We have started by investigating hydroponics as a method of growing fresh food. We will then have mini projects on different aspects such as the chemistry of the Moons surface, politics of the Moon, medicine on the moon and supplying oxygen and waste disposal.....lots to think about.







## **Food Technology**

This week our Year 10 GCSE food and nutrition students have been working on their presentation, decorating and food styling skills in preparation for next year's exams. We have used the Tunnocks teacake challenge as our inspiration, the aim is to decorate a teacake in the most inventive and creative way possible and I think you will agree they have done an amazing job!











## **Sixth Form Update**

The theme for the last two weeks has been personal safety, particularly timely ahead of the summer holidays. Following on from last week's Young Drivers' day, this week in Year 12 we have looked at issues of consent and relationships in which students discussed various aspects of this important area and received information on the law and ethical considerations. An external speaker from 1625 Outreach Harm Reduction Service is also delivering a session in each personal development class on the topic of "Where's the harm?", a look at drugs and alcohol and awareness and their effects on behaviour, judgement and the potential consequences.
