

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Logging on to GO 4 Schools

To access GO 4 Schools go to http://www.go4schools.com/ and click on the 'Parents' icon at the top.



To log on for the first time, click on **First-time User?** enter your email address and click 'New password'. This address must be the one we hold for you on our school systems. If you have changed your email address or need to provide us with one, please contact datateam@qegs.email



Once you have received your password from GO 4 Schools enter your email and new password into the log in page to gain access to the system.

If you have more than one child at QEGS you can choose which to view on the next screen.

If you forget your password use the Forgotten your Password? link. This will email a password reset link to registered email address.


Student Profiles

Residuals

For Years 9-11, this graph shows the difference between your child's Target (Expected Grade at the end of Year 11) and Prediction (Most likely grade at the end of Year 11).

For years 7 and 8, the residual compares the two graded bands.

For Years 12 and 13, this graph shows the difference between your child's Target (set from average GCSE data) and Prediction (Most likely grade at the end of Year 13).



A score of zero indicates that your child is on track.

This shows upcoming homework tasks, a guidance time for completion, the due date and the date set. Clicking on the homework task will bring up more detail, along with any documents that the teacher has uploaded.

This page has two tabs, an attendance summary, and a calendar view.

The session summary shows a count of all attendance marks received by the student and as a percentage of total possible school attendance. Additional charts show the student's overall attendance pattern as the academic year develops week by week. Please note that for each day there will be an 'Unknown' until the registrations are completed that day.


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Behaviour

All behaviour events, positive and negative, are logged in GO 4 Schools.


The first table shows the last five events recorded for your child, but you can also view a full history of their behaviour for the current academic year by clicking **On View behaviour events.** This tab enables the display of all recorded events in date order with options to view additional details including school notes and detention information if applicable.



You will need to click on the behaviour event to open it to read the full content.

Reports

Reports will be issued via GO 4 Schools. When your child's report is published on GO 4 Schools you will receive an email and/or letter informing you that a new report is now available. You can then view all reports for this academic year via 'Reports on the left hand side, and print it if you require a hard copy.

Predicted grades are entered by staff at the end of each half term, and can be viewed at any time.

Classwork/Book checks

These are entered once per term as a behaviour event: Blue, Red, Amber or Green.

3 Rs

Once per term, teachers enter a grade for each of the 3Rs indicating whether students are meeting those expectations:

- Always
- Mostly
- Sometimes, or
- Rarely

Book Check		Commitment to learning and presentation						
Respectful		Students are polite, positive and patient.						
Ready To Achieve		Students have high aspirations, participate in school life and show perseverance.						
Responsible		Students are prepared, punctual and well-presented.						
Book Check								
Blue	Classwork always shows commitment to learning and presentation							
Green	Classwork mostly shows commitment to learning and presentation							
Amber	Classwork rarely shows commitment to learning and presentation							
Red	Classwork never shows commitment to learning and presentation							
Respectful								
1	Your child is always polite, positive and patient - well done!							
2	Your child is polite, positive and patient most of the time.							
3	Sometimes your child is disrespectful and their behaviour disrupts learning.							
4	Your child's disrespectful behaviour disrupts learning often - this is a cause for concern.							
Ready To Achi	eve							
1	Your child has high aspirations, participates and perseveres all of the time - well done!							
2	Your child has high aspirations, participates and perseveres most of the time.							
3	There are times when your child does not try their best or they give up too easily.							
4	Your child's lack of effort, participation or perseverance is a cause for concern.							
Responsible								
1	Your child is always prepared, punctual and well-presented - well done!							
2	Your child is prepared, punctual and well-presented most of the time.							
3	Sometimes your child is unprepared, late to lessons or not wearing the correct uniform.							
4	Your child is often unprepared, late to lessons or not wearing the correct uniform.
