

13B Psychology Homework (Questions Lessons) Timetable

Due to the linear exams, the homework structure will take a different form this year.

You will be having a “Question Lesson” **every Monday A week P3** during the usual lesson you have. Each question lesson will be assessing a different topic. See the table below.

Your homework for the two weeks prior to your question lesson, will be to revise ALL of the content from that unit. You will then be answering questions in exam conditions in the lesson itself.

As your A Level exams are linear, it is imperative that you dedicate enough time to the revision of this content. This is why we, as a department, have decided to introduce this structure.

Feedback will be provided to you following each assessment via your teacher who will mark/moderate your work following your self-assessment. There will however, be a drop-in session should you wish to receive some more detailed or individual feedback. For some of you, this drop-in session will be compulsory. You will be informed of this before the day of the session. For others, this drop-in session will be optional and an opportunity for you to get more specific feedback on the questions and clarify anything that you are unsure of about the unit should you wish to attend.

Although the revision of content for the question lesson and your flipped learning reading will provide the MAJORITY of your homework, your class teacher may ask you to complete other tasks to improve your academic success. These tasks must also be completed.
