## **Duke of Edinburgh's Award - Year 9 Bronze Award Expeditions Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> – Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May and Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> - Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024**

**Trip/Award Leader: Ms Watson Jones**

I am writing to inform you about the plans for the Bronze Expeditions in 2024. The Bronze Practice Expedition will run from Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> to Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2024. The Assessed Expedition will run from Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

### **ONLINE TRAINING**

Over the next few months, students will be required to complete an online training element of the Expedition section. The online training will guide them through the key elements of the Practice weekend (including what best to bring / how to read maps / how to plan a route / basic camp craft etc). There are a few modules each month for students to complete, equating to spending around 30mins per month between December and April.

**Students will then need to create an account for themselves** to complete the online learning. On the landing page, as a parent, you will be able to access all key information regarding the expeditions.

### **IN PERSON TRAINING**

There will be 2 separate in person training sessions. Both the online training and the in-person training sessions are a compulsory part of the DofE Award.

**Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March (clothing equipment check, packing, Trangia and meal preparation)**

**Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> April (equipment handed out, practice of camp craft)**

This training will start during period 5 and **finish at 4.20pm**. Students will be required to bring in their waterproof coats and trousers, as well as walking boots for checking on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

Students will be bringing equipment home on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> April so a lift home for students where possible may be appreciated.

Rich Adventure will also run an in-person route planning session early in the new year. The date is TBC.

### **EXPEDITIONS**

The training days and Assessed Expedition are both an essential part of achieving the Bronze Award.

On both 9<sup>th</sup> May and 4<sup>th</sup> June, students will need to arrive at the start location for **8.30am (locations will be given closer to the time but we aim to keep this within an hour's drive of Ashbourne)**. Students will be met in the mornings by myself and Mrs Wright and will be following a designated route with a qualified and experienced

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instructor who will guide each group through key map and survival skills etc. Please note, during the practice days students will always have a qualified leader with them until they are competent in their expedition skills. We will be camping at designated camp sites (these usually have basic washing facilities / toilet / drinking water). For the Assessed Expedition students will be supervised remotely; each group will have a GPS tracker and be met at 'check points' by their leader.

Pick up is usually around 3.30pm.

## EQUIPMENT

We have a very large cohort of DofE participants this year (which is fantastic!), so if anyone has suitable lightweight tents that may be able to be shared with your child's group, please do get in touch!

It is imperative that students wear suitable walking boots (not shoes), clothing is suitable for walking in (no jeans or denim) and that waterproof coat and trousers are packed, in case of inclement weather. Many outdoor retail places will do a discount for DofE students – the pack that students receive in the post should have a discount card.

Students will be lent, as highlighted on the kit list (attached and on TEAMS), a group Storm Shelter, Trangia (cooking set), a group first aid kit, related maps and route cards, and tents. The groups are responsible for the upkeep and drying out of kit, which needs to be checked back in the week after the Qualifying Expedition. It is expected that groups return the kit in a fit-for-purpose and clean condition; any damage or loss will have to be paid for in addition to the expedition cost. This equipment will be given out to students during the week prior to the Practice Expedition.

Students also need to bring their own food and snacks, as well as fluids and an emergency rations pack, for the full two-day Practice Expedition. It is important that the evening meal is cooked as a group meal and students will be briefed on what is suitable. They will also need to supply their own small camping gas (screw top attachment) canisters for this (2 needed per group).

## COSTS

If for some reason your child cannot attend the dates stated above, please let me know as soon as possible via email. Costs for the expeditions are not refundable, however further opportunities to undertake the Expedition Section of the Award may be available to students next year.

The cost for the Bronze Expedition section of the Award is **£205** (this includes both trips, camping and the online training). Costs are kept to a minimum and the academy does not receive any profit from this. Most of the costs are for assessors/supervisors, qualified staff with Mountain Leader qualifications with many hours of experience in their field. The Duke of Edinburgh's Award risk assessment and safety requirements now insist that qualified and approved staff must be used.

Payment for the Expedition must be paid via ParentPay:
