The ambassadors spent their lunchtimes creating dozens of poppies, which were integrated into the final design. PSHE Lessons for this Half-Term

In this half term our students will be developing their understanding of issues concerned with living in our wider world. These include lessons in financial education for our older students, and lessons on the qualities we need for success with Years 7 and 8. In addition, we have more specialised lessons in such things as consent, responses to violence against women, and the importance of British values that are targeted towards individual Year Groups.

We have also introduced hot topic lessons this year. The first of these focused on the importance of Protected Characteristics under the 2010 Equalities Act, and latterly we have used a session to introduce our new work with Solutions Not Sides, a charity who look at conflict recognition and resolution in Israel and Palestine.

We have also expanded our collaborations with other external organisations to include Derbyshire Children's Services, who are now advising us around our drugs and alcohol education. This means we are adding their expertise to our already strong links with the Department for Education Mental Health teams, Department for Culture Media and Sport, RSA and more.

Food Technology

This week in Food Technology our Year 7 students have been making fruit scones, they have used the rubbing in method and then glazed them before they went into the oven. They all did a fantastic job and only in their second lesson with us!

STEM/Science Club

Some KS3 students had a great time in STEM/Science Cub where we looked at endothermic reactions. They got to make their own instant ice packs, which they thought were amazing! Next time we will be making Ooblek! STEM/Science Club takes place on Thursday lunchtime (Week B-Room 401).



Some students have made Ooblek, which is a non-Newtonian fluid. They had a great time investigating the fluid and how it behaves under stress and without stress. A non-Newtonian fluid is one that has a variable viscosity under stress, so it can become runnier or more solid. Other non-Newtonian fluids are ketchup, custard, toothpaste and paint.

STEM Club runs on Thursday lunchtimes and is available for all KS3 students.
