Canteen Food and Parent Pay System Notification

Please be aware that the Derbyshire Dales County Council Service operating our canteen break and lunch facilities provide food to students on the basis that funds are available for them to spend at the till.

Where an account is topped up on the day, these funds do not always appear with immediate effect on the student's account, and we would ask that parents check the evening before to ensure accounts are in credit well in advance of them purchasing food through the canteen. Some parents have made us aware of inaccuracies with top up and we have asked Derbyshire Catering to follow up and investigate if there are errors in their system. We will update asap.

We will always support families facing financial hardship to ensure their children have access to food in school. However, Derbyshire catering services cannot operate an ongoing debt and credit facility for students and parents.
