Remembrance Sunday

We have had the privilege of listening to stories from Mr Simon Mahoney, Ashbourne Royal British Legion committee member on the importance of remembrance. We have also had the great pleasure of Mr Ewart, the King's representative, the Deputy Lieutenant of Derbyshire and branch president of Ashbourne Royal British Legion in leading us through the Act of Remembrance and a 2-minute silence. Sixth Form Update

Attendance letters were sent to all parents and guardians at the end of the last half term, we will be issuing the next attendance letters at the beginning of the January term. We hope you agree that these are a great way to see where your child is at with their attendance and lateness to lessons and we encourage all parents to continue having discussions regarding the importance of being present in Sixth Form.

We are regularly requested to comment on a candidate's punctuality and attendance when providing references for university, apprenticeships and employment.

We have had some fantastic talks in Year 13 this week as part of our LifeSkills programme including degree apprenticeship talks from an ex-students from Mercedes, the Royal Marines, Prison Officer and a Forensic Officer. These talks have been so valuable for our students in listening and learning about different career paths. The royal marine, ex-student Ellis Greenway, then stayed to repeat the talk to Year 12 and Year 10 students who are interested in going into the forces.

Ex-student Archie Shaw visited Sixth Form on Wednesday to share information and advice from his time at Nottingham Trent University and as a sports coach for Primary Stars with our Sport and Exercise Science students.

Our Year 12 students are working on presentations in LifeSkills for what beyond Sixth Form looks like.

These will be presented in a few weeks time as part of students developing important skills required in life beyond our Sixth Form.



A reminder to all Sixth Form students, if you are applying to university or making a dual application with degree apprenticeships too, please work on completing your UCAS application form sections this week and ensure you have asked for your personal statement to be checked. The final date for submission is the 15th November 2024. The earlier you submit your application the more time we have for any amendments.

House Cross Country

House cross country will take place on **Wednesday 13th November for all Y7 and Y8 students**. To help them prepare for this, students have been taking part in a fitness unit of work, exploring the different elements of fitness and which elements are important for which activities. We know that cross country is enjoyed by lots of students, but it can also make some feel concerned. The House cross country is a participation-based event, where all students get to represent their House, so success for QEGS PE is that all Y7 and Y8 students take part and complete the 2km course.

We obviously want all students to try their best on the day, but if that means that they need to walk some of the course, that is ok. Those that would like to will have the opportunity to race during this event to qualify for the cross-country team and represent QEGS in the Derbyshire Dales Cross Country Championship the following week.

The Y7 event will take place during P1, so all students in Y7 should come to school in their PE kit on Wednesday. They will then get changed into their school uniform after the run and attend their normal lessons P2 onwards. The Y8 event will take place during P4, so all Y8 students will need to bring their PE kit with them on Wednesday.

QEGS Cross Country Team Trial

As part of the cross-country event, athletes from Years 9-13 will be able to sign up to race 4km on Wednesday 13th November, with the top 6 girls and boys from each year group qualifying to run for the school team at the Derbyshire Dales Championship. Students' sign-up by emailing Mr Hallam (<u>hallam@qegs.email</u>) or by going to the PE office and giving their name to a PE teacher at break or lunchtime on Friday 8th or Monday 11th November. The Derbyshire Dales Cross Country Championship will take place on Thursday 21st November and those that perform well in this race will be invited to represent the Derbyshire Dales in the County Championships in January.

Equestrian Team update

Our amazing NSEA team qualified for the National Championships 2024 and competed last month. An epic experience with lots of great teamwork and camaraderie shown.

We achieved 10th place team dressage! Out of 16 teams at our first time in a dressage champs! In showjumping we had a mixed set of results - Brooke finished with a clear in the 1m show jumping and came 22nd/56 individuals and Libbie had 2 unfortunate pole penalties showjumping but finished 16th/31 in the individual dressage.

We were not placed in the 80cm team showjumping - it was a huge field of teams, and we had some unfortunate poles down. Well done to students and thank you to supporting parents and carers.
