Our students each researched and chose someone to represent. The research was then used to create a stitched square, which will become part of the patchwork memory guilt. The guilt will depict 80 candles, each candle representing an individual or group affected by the holocaust.

On the trip we were given the unique opportunity to meet two of the creative team for Christmas at Chatsworth as well as Derbyshire-based video projection artists, Illuminos. The students were able to find out about the process involved in putting together the Christmas displays in the house and gardens, as well as discovering more about the range of careers and pathways available in the heritage and creative sector. The students found it really useful to see how their passion for the creative arts can lead to a wide range of exciting career opportunities. Some have even started looking into the apprenticeships and work placements Chatsworth offer in the creative arts. #### **Year 11 Construction**

Year 11 Construction skills - students are nearing the end of their 3<sup>rd</sup> practical task. So far, they have fitted skirting and dado rails to a stud wall they initially constructed. Then part of the wall was tiled and the remaining area emulsioned with trim glossed.

Students have developed a great range of skills, ranging from planning in detail how to do the job, identifying tools needed, calculating the amount of materials required for the task and developing their practical skills. In all cases students have showed great pride in their work and some exceptional quality work has been completed. Some students even planned the colour scheme for their painting so that it stood out.
