Every attendee will get a free raffle ticket, which includes prizes of wine, cosmetics and sports equipment!



Update - 002 School Bus route from September 2025

The numbers of students eligible for free bus passes on the OO2 school bus will be increasing from September 2025. Therefore the OO2 will no longer allow for fare payers on the route from students in Years 7 to 13, pass holders only.

Fare payers currently using the route can use the SWIFT bus operated by Trent Barton Buses as an alternative, please check their website for times and stops https://www.trentbarton.co.uk/services/swift. Students can travel on the SWIFT using a B-Line card to receive a discounted fare to £1.50 per journey. To apply for a B-Line card, use the link: https://www.derbyshire.gov.uk/transport-roads/public-transport/fares-tickets-passes/b-line/b-line.aspx. The B-Line card number can then be added to the Mango App and student must tap on and off when using the SWIFT service.

Final day of term activities: Thursday 24th July.

We now have all students secured on their chosen activity for the final day of term. There was only one option that we have collapsed due to low numbers, so I'm really pleased to say, the large majority have secured their first option choice.
