QEGS Values & SMSC

Spiritual Development:

- Reflection and Self-Awareness: Encouraging students to reflect on their own beliefs, values, and experiences, and to understand the beliefs of others.
- Curiosity and Wonder: Cultivating a sense of curiosity and wonder, fostering a willingness to explore new ideas and perspectives.
- Creativity and Imagination: Providing opportunities for students to express themselves creatively and to use their imagination to explore different ideas.



Moral Development:

- Recognising Right and Wrong: Helping students understand the concepts of right and wrong, respect for the law, and the consequences of their actions.
- Ethical Reasoning: Developing students' ability to identify and discuss moral and ethical issues, and to form reasoned opinions.
- Respect for Others: Promoting respect for different viewpoints and fostering tolerance and understanding of diverse cultures and beliefs.



Social Development:

- Community Involvement: Engaging students in community projects and activities, fostering a sense of belonging and social responsibility.
- Cooperation and Teamwork: Encouraging collaboration and teamwork and developing students' ability to work effectively with others.
- Conflict Resolution: Providing opportunities for students to learn how to resolve conflicts peacefully and constructively.
- Democratic Values: Promoting an understanding of democratic processes and the importance of participation in civic life.



Cultural Development:

- Appreciating Diversity: Encouraging students to explore and appreciate different cultures, traditions, and perspectives.
- Cultural Exchange: Organising cultural exchange programs and events that allow students to learn from and interact with people from different backgrounds.
- Understanding Cultural Influences: Helping students understand how different cultural influences have shaped their own heritage and the world around them.
