## QEGS - Literacy Toolkit







 Ensure opportunities for literacy and numeracy are provided when appropriate within the lesson.

Whole School Literacy: we are committed to ensuring no child leaves QEGS with a reading age below their chronological age, and literacy is not a barrier to success.



<u>Say it again, better</u>: when a student answers a question verbally, and before they write anything down, ask them to re-form their response with greater depth and sophistication, or using more technical vocabulary.

## The 3 Everys - Every sentence has.

- A capital letter
- A full stop
- Makes sense

By using <u>'The 3 Everys'</u> in all lessons, we ensure QEGS students can accurately construct coherent sentences consistently.



<u>Explicit teaching of key tier 2 & 3 vocabulary</u>: students are taught pronunciation, etymology and applications.

By <u>reading aloud</u> the teacher offers students the working memory capacity to focus on the meanings of words as well as aiding their understanding through intonation and fluency.
