
# Night at the Oscars – CDM Style!

### **DofE updates**

Thank you to everyone who attended the online meeting to launch **Bronze DofE**. It was great to see so much enthusiasm and answer so many questions. For anyone that could not attend, information was sent out with the presentation attached last Friday (3rd October) to all Year 9 parents.

Parent Pay now has the enrolment fee of £31 available to pay. Deadline is <u>Friday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025.</u>
After half term we will start regular fortnightly form time meetings with the Year 9 cohort to explain and guide them through the award. There is nothing to do before then except sign up.

**Silver** DofE Parent Pay for enrolment will be opening shortly and £31 will be due by <u>30th October 2025</u>. All Year 10 students are eligible to complete the award regardless of completion of Bronze award.

After enrolment deadlines, regular form time meetings will start with the Silver cohort to explain and guide them

through Silver award.

Further information on **Gold** award will be released to Year 12 shortly.

The DofE awards evening is coming up on <u>13th November 2025</u>, invitation letters to follow with details of the **event.** Anyone who has completed and had their award 100% signed off by school and the verifier will be contacted with an invitation to attend. Any of previous years Bronze and Silver cohorts who have not yet completed need to do so by <u>19<sup>th</sup> October 2025</u> in time to have their award processed before this awards ceremony. If that date is missed, then there will be a further awards ceremony later in the academic year.
