### **QEGS Remembrance 2025**

This year, QEGS proudly honoured Remembrance through a series of meaningful events that united students, staff, and the wider Ashbourne community.

Our commemorations began with the thoughtful work of our Sixth Form students, who decorated poppies across Ashbourne in the days leading up to Remembrance Week. Thank you to Matthew, Henry, Aled, Ben and Seb in Year 12, and Maya and Evie in Year 13 for supporting this initiative.

In the week leading up to Remembrance Sunday, every year group took part in an assembly reflecting on the importance of remembrance. Throughout the week, we were privileged to welcome several special guests, including the Deputy Lieutenant of Derbyshire, Mr Brell Ewart, who led our Acts of Remembrance with dignity and warmth. We were also joined by Royal Air Force veteran Mrs Sarah Simms and Royal Navy veteran Mr Steve Hughes, all of













whom praised our students for their respect, attentiveness, and maturity during such a significant time.

On Sunday, QEGS students proudly joined the annual Remembrance Parade and Service, filling the streets of Ashbourne with a moving display of respect. Students represented the school in a wide range of community roles, including as Cadets, Scouts, Girl Guides, the Boys' Brigade and many more organisations, all united in a shared act of remembrance. Mrs Ward-Argument and Mr Daughtry marched alongside our students, representing the school community and joining the hundreds who gathered to remember. Among them, Rob (Year 13) was a real asset to the school, leading the main standards in the parade with calm confidence and pride, even supporting those new to the role of standard bearer. Fergus and Hannah (Year 13) represented QEGS beautifully as they read aloud the names of the Second World War fallen from Ashbourne. Georgia (Year 13) carried the school standard with pride, while Izzy and Freya (Year 13) laid a wreath with Mr Garrity on behalf of QEGS, ensuring that our school paid its own tribute.

Every student involved demonstrated a deep sense of respect, and it was clear to all who watched that they made QEGS extremely proud.

On Tuesday, November 11th, the morning began with a special Act of Remembrance by the memorial gates in Ashbourne, attended by pupils from local primary schools, nurseries and members of the local community. We were honoured to be led by a representative from Ashbourne RBL, Royal Navy veteran Ann Smith, whose words reminded students of the courage and sacrifice of those who have served their country. Rob (Year 13) once again carried the main standard with great composure, while Scarlett (Year 13) proudly carried our school standard. Wreaths were laid by Mr Mallender, CEO, and Mr Garrity on behalf of QEGS and QEGSMAT. The Act of Remembrance was made even more poignant by ex-student Arlo's moving performance of *The Last Post* and *Reveille*, a moment that stilled the crowds and reminded everyone present of the solemnity of the occasion. The service continued back at school, where Scarlett (Year 13) also read the war poem *The Green Hills of Ashbourne*, written in memory of those from our town who lost their lives in the First World War, providing a fitting and emotional start to the service. Rev. Dwayne Engh also attended both services and led us in moments of quiet prayer and reflection.

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to everyone involved, our students, staff, guests, and members of the RBL and the local community, for making this year's remembrance so meaningful. Their commitment and conduct throughout these events truly reflected the spirit of QEGS and the strength of our Ashbourne community.

This week, our Year 13 students took part in an exciting Assessment Centre Experience during their Life Skills sessions, expertly prepared with the support of JCB. This built on the practice/mock interviews the students had last half term and the presentation training in Year 12, making our students as equipped as possible for their futures. The session was designed to help students prepare for future application processes, particularly for higher-level apprenticeships and employment opportunities. Students had the chance to experience what real-world assessment activities might look like and to develop key skills in communication, teamwork, and problem-solving.

One highlight of the session involved teams working together to rank a list of items for survival on the moon—a challenging and engaging exercise that encouraged collaboration, reasoning, and negotiation.

Form Tutors, along with Mrs Allen and Mrs Thrupp, facilitated the activities and provided valuable feedback to help students reflect on their performance and identify areas for growth.

Our Year 13s rose to the challenge brilliantly, demonstrating maturity, enthusiasm, and excellent teamwork throughout the session. Well done, everyone!
