## Springboard FutureChef Competition.

Springboard FutureChef is a schools-based programme across England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland that supports the development of key life skills whilst inspiring young people to pursue an exciting career within the world of hospitality. It supports students to build industry based culinary skills and knowledge.

The Springboard FutureChef competition is now the biggest school culinary competition in the UK.

In October we held our first school heat for the Springboard FutureChef competition. Two students were selected to represent QEGs in the local final.

Students had a budget of £6.50 to produce a main meal for two people in 1 hour. Faith G, Year 10, represented QEGs at Vision West Notts College.
