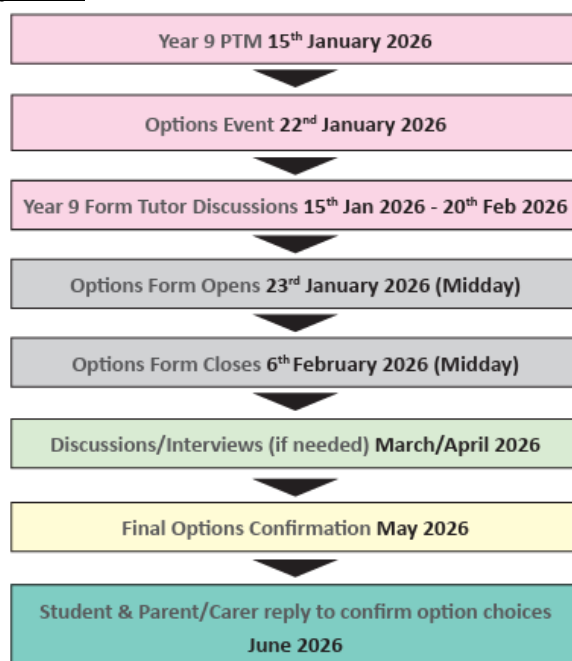
### What an amazing Year 9 Options Evening!
